	<p>With labour outflows emerging as an indispensable feature in the world of work, there is an increasing recognition that even in the case of transnational workers, skills could be a key enabler in enhancing migration outcomes.</p> <p>Skilling, upskilling and skills recognition systems across borders can have multiple benefits – greater employability, improved wages and working conditions for workers; and more efficient job matching, reduced training time and higher productivity for employers. Skill ecosystem in India, has been strengthened by an increased focus on, on-the-job training through apprenticeship, skills recognition, better data collection, pre-departure trainings, and certification, but number of challenges continue to persist when it comes to both inter-state and international migration.</p> <p>With the proposition that skills could be a key enabler in improving migration outcomes, this session seeks to discuss the degree to which our country is geared towards addressing the skilling requirements of prospective migrant workers and the strategies that are currently underway to skill migrants.</p>

	<p>Apprenticeship has been recognized as one of the most efficient ways to develop skilled manpower by utilizing the infrastructure and training facilities available in the establishments.</p> <p>The apprenticeship programme in India formally started with the promulgation of the Apprentices Act 1961. However, even after more than 5 decades, we still have a long way to go in adopting apprenticeship as an effective method for skilling.</p> <p>Keeping this in mind, the Government of India has brought about comprehensive reforms in the Apprenticeship Act in 2014 & the Apprenticeship Rules in 2015 to make apprenticeship more industry friendly. The Government had also launched the National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (NAPS) in August 2016, to promote the apprenticeship programme in India by introducing a package of financial incentive to establishments engaging in apprenticeship.</p> <p>This session will deliberate upon ways to make apprenticeship training more appealing to industries and youth and to tap the huge potential for reaching a tenfold increase in the training numbers.</p>
